

<u>Enrichment Class</u> — Fun with science, music, and art Children 4+ years of age can explore the world of science through simple experiments, cooking, gardening, etc. Musical instruments, simple songs, and basic notes/timing are taught. Art using a variety of mediums is explored.

Children enrolled in the Enrichment class may also go to Lunch Bunch afterwards up until 3:00PM for an additional \$7/hour. Just sign up and pay the days you want your child to stay at Lunch Bunch afterwards.

Motor Development

Class— Each class attends a Motor Development class a few times each month.

Motor Development is held in our Fellowship Hall.

It is a special class using



special equipment that helps in the development of large motor skills.

The philosophy of <u>The Outdoor Classroom</u> is "anything you can do indoors, you can do better outdoors." Besides our raised garden beds and being part of the Pacific Corridor for Monarch butterflies, we introduce children to concepts of recycling, upcycling, reducing and reusing, and water conservation. They also have fun on our wonderful playgrounds, patios, and in our gardens playing (and looking for bugs and lizards).
